Thank you for your reply to me regarding the above, dated 30<sup>th</sup> November 2009.

I am pleased that the allegations are now being properly considered having been rejected by the UK Police.

I also understand from articles in the press that "...while the ICC has said that it will not conduct prosecutions <against the UK> for the Crime of Aggression until it has been defined by its own working group, the court's chief prosecutor, Luis Moreno-Ocampo, told the *Sunday Telegraph* in 2007 that **he would be willing to launch an inquiry into US/UK war crimes in Iraq**. Charges could also be brought against <Tony> Blair at the ICC for failing to conduct the war in a "proportionate manner"..."

I find this all very encouraging that justice will now be done and I very much look forward to hearing from you as to the outcome of your decision on this case.

In the meantime **please let me know of the likely approximate timeframe** for your decision so that I can plan this into my other activities in this matter.

And of course, if I can be of any further assistance please let me know.
